Hosted by the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) Dept of Federal Affairs in Washington, DC, "Advocacy Day" has been part of the Academy's initiative to increase advocacy participation and skills among residents. The Academy has scheduled its next one-day Advocacy Training for pediatric residents on **Wednesday, April 23, 2008 from 8:30am to 4:00pm in Washington, D.C.**

Advocacy Day participants receive a full morning of advocacy training, including learning basic skills and discussing in-depth one child health legislative issue. The afternoon is spent meeting with congressional offices to present the issue and put new advocacy skills to use.

As many of you know, in the past we were very fortunate to cover the travel costs through the AAP Friends of Children Fund for a select number of residents to attend this training. Due to budgetary constraints, we will be unable to provide any travel assistance awards for the spring 2008 Advocacy Day.
